# **Homework & Class Information---**

#### Music

Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th October 3 - October 6

As there was no school on Monday, we will only meet once this week. Each class will review what we did last week and incorporate a few new concepts to practice over the weekend.

#### Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade

We are practicing This Little Light of Mine in multiple ways:

- Singing solfege notes (Do Do Do Mi Fa... etc)
- Clapping out the melodic rhythm while looking at sheet music on the white board.
- Practicing focus, rhythm, and ear training, as well as quarter note, quarter rest, and eighth note recognition. We are learning four separate rhythm parts that do not match the melody.
- Singing with motions that reflect the lyrics and let us get our wiggles out during class.

If we have time this week, we will begin to learn an elementary harmony part.

We are also about 3/4 of the way through learning the hand motions for Do Re Mi; if we have time at the end of class we will practice this as well.

#### Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

We will review Rhythm Exercise 2, practicing our recognition of half notes, quarter notes, and quarter rests.

We will learn four new notes on our Pentatonic Scale: closed positions (requiring a finger on the string) for low A, D, high G, and high C. We will play through the scale and see how far we can get on the exercises.

Over the weekend I would like them to finish their Lesson 2 theory pages: Line and Space Notes, and begin clapping out their Rhythm Exercise 3. I will also be giving them a simple song, 'The Boatman,' that uses only four notes: Open G, Closed A, Open C, and Closed D.

The goal is to be able to keep their eyes on the page while trusting that their hand will find the correct position. While they are first practicing, they may need to look a little, but after playing it through more than once, they should be able to keep their eyes on their music and not on their hands. Please encourage this! Remind them that their ears are just as good at hearing whether or not their fingers are in the right position:)

All of the above info will be on their homework page.

#### Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 4th grade

We will play through both parts of 'In the Bleak Midwinter.' Our goal is to be able to assign parts and have two groups duet both parts at the same time. We are also reviewing intervals and the difference between reading literally (one note at a time) and by interval (starting to recognize the distance between notes, which helps with their future ability to transpose from key to key.)

They will bring home Rhythm Exercise 7, Theory pages on Sharps and Flats, and the song "What Child Is This" to begin learning over the weekend.

Thank you for encouraging your students to practice!
