Music
Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th
January 29 - February 2
Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade
We will be continue working on learning new movements to Higher than the Sky. We will also continue singing our solfege challenge. We may begin a new rhythm chapter if we have time.

Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade
Our class will continue our discussion of Scales and Key signatures, while we work on Wiegenlied and review our F Scale.

We will also revisit the importance of playing warm-up scales at every practice session. This is always listed on your child's homework, and it is part of what helps them build both muscle memory and reading recognition for each note. While they may resist doing them because they feel they have already 'learned' the scale, warming up with the scales regularly will help their overall reading skill develop over time, and make reading each new song that much easier. Feel free to check their progress on this - if they cannot easily play the scale, it's a sure sign that they have not been practicing it each week.

We are learning new skills with our right hand as we learn basic arpeggios with Wiegenlied, along with strengthening our G, C, and F chords.

## Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 4th grade

Our class will continue our review of music theory, the Circle of 5ths, key signatures, and Major and related Minor keys.

We will continue to work on our picking pattern for the Hall of Fame, and building muscle tone with our Bb chord.

We are also discussing our next steps as we move forward into exploring other scales.
