# Homework & Class Information---

Music Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th February 5 - February 9

Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade

We will continue to learn and practice a variety of cross-body motions this week. They will also be singing and memorizing songs that will help them with identifying music notes. Right now we have two that we alternate between, both about EGBDF, the names of the lines on the treble clef staff.

## Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

We are continuing our fingerpicking and arpeggio practice with Wiegenlied, and preparing to duet by counting through and working on the melody.

This class has some students whose siblings have been learning Higher than the Sky in the 1st/2nd grade class, and they have expressed interest in learning to play it on the ukulele. We may start working on chords for this song if we have time this week.

### Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 4th grade

We will work through our transposition homework this week, and look at the different voicings that are created by changing keys on the ukulele.

We are practicing a new fingerpicking pattern, and strengthening the forefinger muscles in our left hand in order to be better able to make bar chords. This will determine the song choices available to us for the spring concert.

# Mr. Raj – Grades 5 & 6 February 5 - February 9

As we continue working through MAP testing, some subjects may have less work to provide time to MAP test.

Science. This week we will focus on learning how to organize data when conducting experiments and how to outline what project students are doing as well as how a materials and procedures list should look like.
