# Homework \& Class <br> Information--- 

## Music

Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th
February 20 - February 23
This is a short music week, so most of the work will be done at home. Please check in with your students to see how they are doing with the material on their practice sheets. Have them play for you! Some students have been practicing what they like, without doing the actual assignment. While this may keep them entertained, it will not help them pass the class.

Remember, students are learning to read music as a long term activity - they will continue to use this skill next year, either in intermediate ukulele or in beginner band. Practice makes progress!!

Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade We will continue to practice our cross body motions and the first verse and chorus of Higher than the Sky, on our EGBDF songs, and our rhythm unit.

Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade
We will continue to work on Wiegenlied students should have been working hard on this over the long weekend, so we will duet both parts in class.

Please ask your kids to show you how they are doing on the top line (melody) of
Wiegenlied. Some students have already mastered it; others clearly need to put in more practice time. We are also continuing to learn new chords and develop our right hand fingerpicking skills.

Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 3rd and 4th grade This class is working on improving their bar chords. This takes a fair amount of muscle building at the base of the pointer finger and left forearm. At home they should be doing "squish practice" where they practice "squishing" and then releasing the bar chord into a mute while they strum. I expect them to do this with each practice session, as it takes many sessions to build up the muscles to be able to make the chords well.

We will also go over their chord analysis homework and review how their chord choices sound. They will continue this homework this weekend on the 3rd beat of each measure of In the Sweet By and By.
