

Music

Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th February 26 - March 1

Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade

We will be learning the motions to the second verse of Higher than the Sky this week, and will continue to practice our cross-body windmills, claps, and squares.

We will also keep memorizing the lines and spaces on the treble clef, and practicing our eighth, quarter, and half notes.

Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

I am hoping to fully duet Wiegenlied this week so that we can move on to practicing In the Sweet By and By.

Depending on how the above duet goes, the class may be starting to work on the harmony part, as well as a simplified chord harmony, while singing.

Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 3rd and 4th grade

We will be working on learning the chord melody part to In the Sweet By and By.

This part requires the Bb chord, which uses a fair amount of finger strength, so they should still be doing their squish practice at home to build up the muscles of their pointer finger and forearm.

We will discuss how, on the third beats of each measure, the notes don't always match up exactly with the chords we are choosing, and get some practice naming the chords that the combined triads + melody and harmony notes produce.

We will also discuss song options for the upcoming spring concert.


