Music

Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th
March 11 - March 15

For all 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grade parents: **Mark the date for Education Sabbath - Saturday April 27th!** The Music and Motion class and the Ukulele classes are all working on music to demonstrate what they've been learning for you. Please let me know if your child will *not* be able to attend, as I am choosing performance partners this week.

Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade

We are working on getting used to the lines we will be performing in for Higher Than The Sky, and moving around the room so that everybody gets to be in front for at least part of the song.

We will also revisit our Do Re Mi and continue to memorize our lines and spaces with the EGBDF song.

Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

Our focus at the beginning of this week is on In the Sweet By and By, singing and playing our harmony part, and for those who are ready for it, adding in the C and F chords to try our skill at chord melody playing.

We will also practice our chords - G, D, Dm, Am, Em, F and C - to prepare for our upcoming performances.

Students will also begin learning the F scale up the neck this week. This is the same F scale they have already been playing, in a new position up the neck (same notes, different location). Over the weekend they should be practicing this on the song Johnny on the Woodpile.

Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 3rd and 4th grade

Squish practice should be continuing at home as students build up their forefinger muscles in order to strengthen their bar chords.

We will continue to practice our songs for the upcoming Education Sabbath, and start writing potential introductions for ourselves and our songs.

We are also beginning work on Million Dreams - being able to pick and sign the intro and the verse, and those students who are interested in doing extra work will begin working on the bar chords for Happy.

Phonics: TK will be reviewing letter sounds. Kindergarten will be writing and reading short vowel words.

Math: We will be learning number bonds this week.
