



Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade

We are continuing to practice Higher than the Sky - if you haven't seen it yet, ask them to show you over spring break! The song is on YouTube by Gateway Kids. We will also practice our EGBDF notes and Do Re Mis.

Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

This week we will solidify our part on In the Sweet By and By, singing and playing our harmony part. They should be able to practice this on their own over spring break. Those who want a challenge will be adding their C and F chords in on the first beat of each measure while still playing the melody notes.

We will work on our F scale up the neck with Johnny on the Woodpile, learning our new playing position.

We will play through Sky Full of Stars and practice our chords - G, D, Dm, Am, Em, F and C, and begin work on the intro and chords to Million Dreams.

Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 3rd and 4th grade

Squish practice should be continuing at home as students build up their forefinger muscles in order to strengthen their bar chords.

We will continue to play through our songs for Education Sabbath, and write introductions for ourselves and our songs.

We are also beginning work on Million Dreams being able to pick and sign the intro and the verse, and those students who are interested in doing extra work will begin working on the bar chords and strum for Happy.
