Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade
We will be revisiting This Little Light of Mine and our Do Re Mis, while also practicing our moves for Higher than the Sky.

Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

We are taking some time to go over our chord progressions on He's Got the Whole World In His Hands, Peace Like a River, and Sky Full of Stars. Focus is still on being able to transition between chords smoothly and easily without looking. We will also continue to practice singing and playing our harmony part to In the Sweet By and By, and learning the chords and intro to Million Dreams.
