## Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th <br> April 22- April 26

Education Sabbath is this Saturday, April 27th! All classes are excited to be sharing their worship songs with you. The service and program begins at 10:00.

I am looking for one or two parents from each grade to help out with kid-wrangling that morning.

1st/2nd should arrive early to begin their warm up at 9:30 in the music room. I will need to leave them by 9:40/9:45 to join the $3 \mathrm{rd} / 4$ th graders for their warm up. I would appreciate some help with walking the kids to the sanctuary and being with them while they sit in their assigned seats before the service begins. (They are also singing with the Kindergarteners and may continue warming up with them depending on Mr. Hearn's schedule)

3rd/4th should arrive at 9:40 and begin tuning in the mother's room of the sanctuary.

I will be asking them to go ahead and begin their warm up on their own, before I get there, but it is always nice to have a parent or two present to help keep them on track.
