This and That

Good Morning,

Today, students in grades 1-8 will be receiving a summary of how they did in their most recent MAP Growth test. Just as a reminder, the test adapts to your child's responses in real time to measure your child's skill level.

On the report you will see two different scores. The first is **Achievement** which shows how well your child has learned in a subject compared to similar students nationwide.

The second score will show **Average Growth**. Growth is a measure of your child's personal progress over the year. This can be a tricky one because at a glance you might look and see the 10th Percentile of Growth and panic; DON'T. If your child's Achievement is above the national average, and in many cases, high above the national average, their Growth is going to be slower because they are performing well out of their grade level.

For example: I might have a 4th grade student who in the Fall had an Math Achievement score of 82nd percentile (Remember 50th percentile means they are at grade). If their Achievement for Winter is 85th, their Growth would be considered low, but since they are already so above grade level, it is going to be hard for a 4th grader to grow in leaps and bounds when they would be given questions at the 6th/7th grade level.

Now the same could be true for the opposite way. If I have a 4th grader who in the Fall had an Math Achievement score of 34th percentile and in the Winter was at 55th percentile, their Growth would be more significant.

I hope this has made a bit of sense. If you have any questions about these scores, please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher.
