We are excited that it is now time to REGISTER for the 2022-2023 school year.! Last week, Carina emailed you Enrollment Packet. If you didn't receive them, please contact her ASAP. Please make sure that after you complete the online portion, you stop by the office to pay your deposit; this will secure your child's place in their classroom.

Currently, registration is open to returning families and new Kindergarten students. At the end of this week, registration will open for new families. We have several families on a waiting list and they will be allowed to begin the registration process. By registering now, we are able to provide the right staffing and materials that will be needed for the upcoming school year.

If you are <u>not</u> planning on returning (does not apply to 8th grade students) we need you to go on to your Family FACTS Portal and select the box that says you will not be returning for the 2022-2023 school year.

When you register by May 1st, you will receive a \$50 discount on each of your children's registration fees. Registering early also helps the teachers know how many students will be in their classroom and what materials to order before they leave for summer vacation.

Mr. Raj – Grades 5 & 6 April 4 – April 8

Students last week were each provided a folder to organize materials that they receive for dissections. Dissections will be starting next week.

Outdoor Ed.: Our outdoor ed. trip is May 9-12th. I will begin sending information and details periodically as we get closer to the date.

Science: We will be working through Chapter 2 of the textbook, but it will also include dissections. This week we will include lessons in prep for the dissections.

Bible: we are focusing on studying Psalms 23 in preparation for presentation and education Sabbath

Math: Green Book: We are continuing to work through Chapter 5. Assessment is set for April 14

Bible: This month we will focus our energy on Psalms 23 in preparation for Education Sabbath.

ELA: Unit 20. There will be a Kahoot on Thursday, but NO TEST on Friday. Words are on Google Classroom. Reading groups have been assigned a new book. Each student will write a 1 paragraph summary of the reading to be presented in class.

AR: 4th Quarter reading goals have been set. Please encourage your child to keep on reading!

Social Studies: This week we are studying Imperialism and how the United States used it. They will have one assignment that covers the entire chapter. We are also learning the Presidents

this quarter. They will get a packet with 10 Presidents preparing for the first quiz. They need to know spelling and dates of presidency. Frist quiz is April 8. Final test will be on June 1st.

Science: We are continuing to work through chapter 13, with a few labs intermixed to help deepen our understanding of the concepts.
