Science - Chapter 7, Lesson 3.

Social Studies - Chapter 1, Lesson 3. We will begin learning about the different regions (coast, valley, desert, mountain) in California. Students will have a California Geography Paper that will come home on Mondays and will be due on Friday. They will need to go online to find some of the answers. We will remind them to always ask their parents before they get on their computers. They will have a new lesson every week for the next nine weeks.
