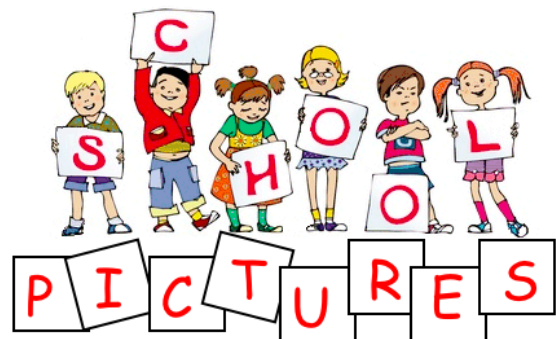


Hot lunch is available for purchase every Wednesday. Cost of hot lunch is \$5.00 per meal and will be applied to your FACTS tuition account.

Ms. May - Grades 3 & 4

We are continuing our review of September's songs and exercises, our pentatonic scale, and the ability to recognize when a note is in closed (requiring a finger on the string) or open (left hand free) position.

Students who practice regularly are beginning to pull ahead of those who have not, so by the end of this month we may split into groups based on skill level. Please ask students to show you what they have been working on and encourage them to practice.

They should be able to play part 1 of We Will Work Together easily by now; they are working on identifying and incorporating closed notes in 'Music's Everywhere' and part 2 of WWT above. For a challenge, see how they are doing on Lesson 3 Exercise 6 - if they haven't already practiced this, they should at least be able to look at each note individually and use their Note ID questions to figure it out.

Please help them remember to bring their binders and ukulele to class on Mondays and Wednesdays!

Mrs. Poblano - Choir - Grades 5-8

We are off to a great start with August and September full of getting to know you activities and exploring music through vocal expression, bucket drumming, boomwackers, personal performances and even some M&Ms to keep life sweet.

As we transition into October it's full speed ahead on Christmas music and concert material. This group of students have not had a lot of choral training and according to them, many strongly dislike singing. Imagine my surprise when I picked a Christmas Piece with 4 solo parts and had 14 kids audition IN CLASS and IN FRONT of their peers!! I was so impressed with their courage and talent that I quickly had to pivot and add another song to our concert to include more kids who could sing solos. I have not assigned specific solo parts yet but will do so within the next week. Once those parts have been established I will tell the kids that they can practice their part at home by using the UTUBE video. Some of you may need to supervise your child with this but it is the only way I can have them practicing their part unless you can accompany them at home. If you have that ability to accompany your child while they practice and need a copy of the music please let me know.

We have a new additional performing arts class that is optional for kids to participate in Skits or Stick Ministry. This class will be by audition and I will be limiting the size to a small group of 5th - 8th that will meet at 12:15 starting Oct. 11. I have several pieces I would like to do over the school year.

I am giving you plenty of notice for dress code for Christmas Concert and Performing Arts class.

Here is the required dress code for these performances.

Performing Arts

Same dress for all students. BLACK SLACKS and BLACK TEE SHIRT- no graphics or brand logo. PLAIN BLACK

Christmas Concert

Boys- BLACK SLACKS and WHITE COLLARED SHIRT (tie is optional but they can wear if they choose) BLACK SHOES AND SOCKS. NO SHORTS, SWEAT PANTS, HATS, TEE SHIRTS OR FLIP FLOPS.

Girls- BLACK AND WHITE ATTIRE. CAN BE DRESS, SKIRT AND SHIRT OR PANTS AND SHIRT. They will be up on stage and risers so please make sure length of attire is appropriate. Super short attire is not acceptable.

I am not expecting you to spend a lot of money on new clothes but it is important that the kids look fairly uniform in presentation.
