Ms. May - Grades 3 & 4

This Wednesday I will be checking students individual progress to assess which group they will be in going forward. Please encourage them to practice ahead of time.

They are working on:

- 1. Identifying and playing the pentatonic scale particularly the closed notes (which require them to put a finger down on the string). Practicing part 2 of We Will Work Together, and Part 1 of Rocky Mountain. If they haven't practiced in a few days, they may need to start each practice session with ID-ing the notes one at a time and finding them on the ukulele.
- 2. Learning their chord shapes for C, Am, F, and G. If they can switch easily between C and G, starting on the D chord. Practicing He's Got the Whole World in His Hands, in 2 keys, C and G. Working on switching easily between chords, and strumming steadily with an even rhythm using either their thumb or pointer finger.
- 3. For Show & Tell they can strum and sing Everybody Loves Saturday Night, which we learned last week.

I've noticed that some students have been practicing older material - things that were assigned the week before, etc. So even though you may see them practicing, it may not be their assigned homework (!) Their practice sheet has the most recent Monday or Wednesday date on it, and they should be working on the most recent assignments.

At the end of this month I will be quizzing the students on the concert Bb major scale, which we have been going over in class.

I may have pop quizzes which require the students to have their instrument, music, and a pencil to get full credit.

Mrs. Poblano - Choir - Grades 5-8

As we transition into October it's full speed ahead on Christmas music and concert material. This group of students have not had a lot of choral training and according to them, many strongly dislike singing. Imagine my surprise when I picked a Christmas Piece with 4 solo parts and had 14 kids audition IN CLASS and IN FRONT of their peers!! I was so impressed with their courage and talent that I quickly had to pivot and add another song to our concert to include more kids who could sing solos. I have not assigned specific solo parts yet but will do so within the next week. Once those parts have been established I will tell the kids that they can practice their part at home by using the UTUBE video. Some of you may need to supervise your child with this but it is the only way I can have them practicing their part unless you can accompany them at home. If you have that ability to accompany your child while they practice and need a copy of the music please let me know.

We have a new additional performing arts class that is optional for kids to participate in Skits or Stick Ministry. This class will by audition and I will be limiting the size to a small group of 5th -8th that will meet at 12:15 starting Oct. 11. I have several pieces I would like to do over the school year.

I am giving you plenty of notice for dress code for Christmas Concert and Performing Arts class. <u>Here is the required dress code for these</u> performances.

Performing Arts

Same dress for all students. BLACK SLACKS and BLACK TEE SHIRT- no graphics or brand logo. PLAIN BLACK

Christmas Concert

Boys- BLACK SLACKS and WHITE COLLARED SHIRT (tie is optional but they can wear if they choose) BLACK SHOES AND SOCKS. NO SHORTS, SWEAT PANTS, HATS, TEE SHIRTS OR FLIP FLOPS.

Girls- BLACK AND WHITE ATTIRE. CAN BE DRESS, SKIRT AND SHIRT OR PANTS AND SHIRT. They will be up on stage and risers so please make sure length of attire is appropriate. Super short attire is not acceptable. I am not expecting you to spend a lot of money on new clothes but it is important that the kids look fairly uniform in presentation.
