**Here is the required dress code for these performances.**

#### Performing Arts

Same dress for all students. BLACK SLACKS and BLACK TEE SHIRT- no graphics or brand logo. PLAIN BLACK

**Boys-** BLACK SLACKS and WHITE COLLARED SHIRT (tie is optional but they can wear if they choose) BLACK SHOES AND SOCKS. NO SHORTS, SWEAT PANTS, HATS, TEE SHIRTS OR FLIP FLOPS.

**Girls-** BLACK AND WHITE ATTIRE. CAN BE DRESS, SKIRT AND SHIRT OR PANTS AND SHIRT. They will be up on stage and risers so please make sure length of attire is appropriate. Super short attire is not acceptable.
