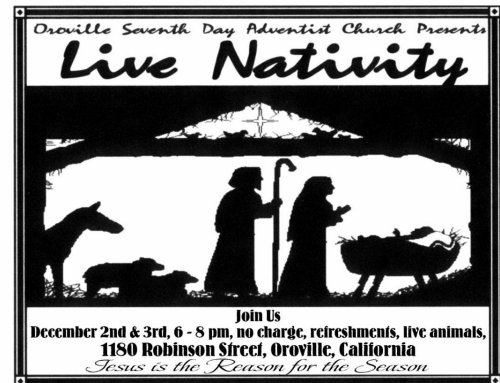


Baptism Preparation Classes
