## **Homework & Class Information---**

Music March 6 - March 10

Ms. May - Grades 3 & 4

**Beginners** are being quizzed on the top portion of Wiegenlied, and continuing to work on mastering their F scale. They will be learning a new song, Johnny on the Woodpile this week as well.

The two chord songs they have been working on (Try Everything and Waka Waka) are progressing nicely, but I am encouraging all students to use stress balls or clothespins at home in order to work on increasing finger strength. Some students are having trouble keeping their knuckles high while making chords (especially the G chord). Part of their homework this week is to find something that they can use at home for finger strengthening, so if you can help them with this, I'd appreciate it. It doesn't have to be a stress ball - any ball that fits into their hand can work. Even dryer balls, or a large pair of heavy socks. The goal Is to press down with the tips of the fingers while keeping the knuckles tall, then release the pressure. Doing repetitions of 10-20 finger presses with the left hand, and then repeating this cycle twice more. A clothespin also works, but only exercises one finger at a time. There are tiny muscles in the middle of the finger that need to develop in order for smooth chord playing, and doing these exercises will help. This takes no mental effort, so they should be able to do them with their left hand while reading or working on other homework.

**Intermediate** students have some exercises this week that can really benefit from the use of a metronome. If you do not already have one, it would be great if you can help them download one on a device that they are allowed to use. The one I recommend is a free app called Speakbeat, and instead of a clicking noise counting out the beats it says them "one and two and three and four and" etc. Long Long Ago Variations is full of 8th notes, so I'm asking them to play it as slowly as they need to, in order to focus on the notes and play them with smooth and even timing. A metronome will help them learn what that smooth timing should sound like. They are also welcome to 'speed trial' this song - practicing it at a very slow speed first (ie, 30 beats per minute) before increasing the speed to 35, 40, etc. as they improve their recognition of the piece. They should go back to a slower speed and keep

working on it if they reach a speed in which they can no longer play accurately.

They will be duetting the regular version of Long, Long Ago this week, playing both parts and singing in class. They are doing well on the Dm and Fm chords for the song "How Far I'll Go" from the movie Moana, and continue to work on their Bb chord exercises in preparation for Malie's song by Keali'i Reichel. This chord requires more finger strength than any we have worked on so far, so I am also recommending they do finger strengthening exercises as described above in the Beginner section.

Thank you for reminding them to practice!




