Beginners are being quizzed on Johnny on the Woodpile this week. We will continue to work on Wiegenlied, especially the arpeggios on the Uke 2 part, and will also start on Au Clair de la Luna, a traditional French folk song.

All students should be working on improving finger strength at home, with either stress balls, dryer balls, clothespins, etc. 10 squeezing repetitions 3x each is recommended. For more on this, please revisit last week's news notes.

Intermediate Students are working hard on speed trialing their Long, Long Ago Variation - this is one of the hardest exercises for this level, as there are few breaks between notes and it requires strong focus and concentration. They should be practicing with a metronome, and moving from a relatively slow bpm to a faster one as they warm up and progress. There are many free metronome apps available. If you can find one that speaks the beats (I found out last week from the kids that SpeakBeat is iOS only), that is best, but not a requirement.

We are beginning work on Malie's Song this week, practicing both the melody and the chords, and learning the correct pronunciation for the first verse, in Hawaiian. I will also be sending them home with a hymn to practice, How Great Thou Art. Feel free to request that they Show & Tell their progress on either of these.
