We are ramping up for our spring performance, so for the most part your students know what they ought to be practicing - and I hope they are practicing!

If it is not already in your calendars, our performance is taking place on Wednesday, May 24th. I will find out more about dress rehearsal timing this week, and will let you know if it is not taking place during regular school hours.

Beginners are working on Au Clair de la Lune in F. I do have two beginners who are interested in playing this in the second position, and transposing down to D with the intermediate students. I am working with them to confirm this is achievable by our performance date. They are also practicing Try Everything - working on changing chords consistently and smoothly, and strumming with a free and relaxed right hand.

Intermediate students are keeping sharp on Au Clair de la Lune in both F and D, practicing their singing and pronunciation on Malie's song, and practicing their picking and strumming patterns for How Far I'll Go. As a group, they are also creating an introduction to each song that will inform and entertain.
