After School Care is available on regularly scheduled school days. Monday through Thursday from dismissal until 6 p.m., and on Fridays from dismissal until 5:30 p.m.
All students who have not been picked up from school by 3:15 p.m. Monday - Thursday or by 12:15 p.m. on Friday will be automatically enrolled in After School Care.
Charges will start at $3: 30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. on Mondays Thursdays and at 12:30 p.m. on Fridays.
Parents/guardians will sign out their student from after care upon picking them up. The cost for after school care is $\$ 7.00$ per child per hour with a minimum charge of one full hour.

## Updated Volunteer Information

As mentioned in the Parent Orientation meeting, our volunteer process and requirements has CHANGED as of August 2023.

California Assembly Bill 506 (AB506) requires that Volunteers must be Live Scanned and complete Child Protection/Mandated Reporter Training.

If you were Live Scanned last school year, you do NOT need do this again. But you DO need to complete the NEW training Child Abuse Mandated Reporter Training Go to htps:// www.mandatedreporterca.com to complete it. Instructions were included in your orientation packet.

To help parents that are NOT live scanned, we have hired a mobile Livescan for fingerprints to come on campus on the day listed below. Appointment not required, just show up with your form filled out and photo ID.

Music

Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th
September 5 - September 8
So excited to be starting music this week with both the $1 \mathrm{st} / 2$ nd grade and the $3 \mathrm{rd} / 4$ th grade classes.

The Introduction to Music class will begin learning their solfège symbols and singing their Do Re Mis.
Both ukulele classes will be picking up their ukuleles and bringing their contracts home for you to sign. They will also have a show and tell agreement that can be made with any family member or trusted adult. Whoever signs this should be willing to ask your student regularly about what they are learning in music class, and encourage them to show you what they have been learning. This can be something small, like a new note or chord. Please remind them that "showing" is not the same as "performing" = this is not meant to be high pressure or perfect; just a short and sweet check in that allows them to share their learning journey with someone else. Grandparents \& Aunties are great for this!

Your interest goes a long way in helping them remember to practice.

## Mrs. Moon - TK/Kindergarten September 5 - September 8

Bible Story: "Up in a Tree" The story of Zacchaeus and when he met Jesus. Luke 19:1-10. Bible Verse: "Love each other, as I have loved you." John 15:12
Math: Our focus shape this week is a square, we will be writing numbers 1-5 and also counting objects 1-5.
Phonics: We will continue to rhyme words. We will also be learning about the letter sounds m and a . We will practice writing our letters and learning the proper formation of the letters $\mathrm{m}, \mathrm{s}$, a, f.
