## Dear Parents,

This week we will begin our first session of MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) testing. MAP testing is an essential tool that teachers use to measure the academic growth and progress of our students over time. We have a two week window for students to take the tests. These two weeks consist of the 1st week being the testing window and the 2 nd week being used for make-up testing for students who may have been absent. Students are not testing everyday. Grades 1-2 have two tests that take about 30-45 minutes to complete and Grades 3-8 have 3 required tests.

MAP testing is a computer-adaptive test that is designed for students in grades $\mathrm{K}-12$. The test assesses students' knowledge across multiple subjects and provides valuable insights into their academic strengths and weaknesses. The test also provides individualized, actionable data that teachers can use to adjust their instruction to meet the specific needs of each student.

There are numerous benefits to MAP testing that make it an essential part of our educational strategy. Firstly, MAP testing gives teachers a clear understanding of where each student is academically, allowing them to tailor instruction and provide support where needed. This ensures that students are continuously growing and progressing, rather than stagnating in their learning.

Secondly, MAP testing helps students take ownership of their learning by tracking their progress across multiple subjects. This empowers them to set goals, measure their progress, and identify areas in which they need to improve.

Finally, MAP testing also benefits parents by providing them with actionable data about their child's academic progress. This information allows parents to support their child's learning journey both in and out of the classroom.

## Homework \& Class Information--- <br> Music <br> Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th <br> September 18 - September 20

Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade
This week we will be playing some games with ear training, and beginning to learn the notes to This Little Light of Mine. We will be learning the song in three different ways - by looking at the notes on the whiteboard and singing them, learning to sing it with the Do Re Mi hand motions, and also learning a separate motion sing-a-long that is a little more active and fun.

We are also continuing to review and practice the Do Re Mi song with our motions. We hope to be able to sing and make the hand motions for the first four notes by the end of this week.

## Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

Thank you so much for getting your contracts and show and tell agreements back to me! Everyone is now set up with their ukulele and music binders.

This week we will be learning how to ID our notes in Lessons 1 and 2. You can help your kids with this if they are having trouble by reminding them to ask the following questions:

1. Is the note on a line or a space?
2. How would you describe the line or space (ie, first line on the bottom, or the space that is two lines below the staff) - any descriptive language that helps them fix their image of the note in space.
3. Which note does that match on the answer key? They have a page of open scale notes that shows the names of the four strings as well as what each note looks like. All of their exercise 1 and 2 notes will be found on this page.

We will also start with the basics of timing, using call and response in class.

Kids often feel like they ought to be able to "know" the notes when they get home, because when we cover them in class, they are able to recognize them by the end of class. Then when they get home they may feel overwhelmed or like they've forgotten everything. Feel free to remind them that music is a language and they are still learning their alphabet - AND, that they have the tools to figure out the answers. It is much better to do the steps above to ID the notes correctly than to guess because they feel like they should already know.

By the end of this week they should be practicing Lesson 2: singing Row Row Row Your Boat, He's Got the Whole World in His Hands, and Mary Had a Little Lamb, while playing their C and G notes as shown on their homework.

If you are able to help them with tuning their instruments at home, that is always appreciated.

## Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 4th grade

We are still waiting on some of the ukulele contracts in this group! Please sign and return with your students as soon as possible. Thank you!

We are reviewing our second position scales and several students have forgotten how to recognize the notes and scales together. They are still playing the scale by ear and finger memory, but when looking at the notes on paper, are not sure which finger position applies to that note.

In this case their note ID homework (see info in Uke 1 above) corresponds to the second position which string and finger should be pressed down for which note? They have written the information for this on their scales, so they do have the tools to figure out the answers.

They are also beginning work on In The Bleak Midwinter, the Uke 1 part, in BOTH first and second positions. Second position is the one I would prefer that they work harder on, as that is the one more of them are having difficulty remembering. If they are telling you that they cannot figure it out, please remind them of the above note ID steps.

If we have time, we will also be working on singing in thirds.
