Homework & Class Information---Music

Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th September 25 - September 29

Date

This week we will be practicing rhythm games, and continuing the Do Re Mi song through So with our solfège hand positions. We'll work our wiggles out by singing & stretching to the This Little Light of Mine. Ask your littles to show you! :)

Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

We will review our Lesson 2 songs and begin working on recognizing four more notes with Lesson 3: the Pentatonic Scale. This lesson requires students to start remembering finger placement to put the correct finger on the correct fret for each 'closed' note. The pattern they are learning uses their left hand's middle finger for the 2nd fret, and ring finger for the 3rd fret. They will also have some theory pages to fill out, as they get used to recognizing and naming notes on the treble clef.

Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 4th grade

Last week it turned out that we needed more time for review than I'd initially thought, so we will be going over some earlier lessons to review our rhythm reading and our second position scales. We will be playing Johnny on the Woodpile, and hope to be back to working on our dotted quarter notes and In the Bleak Midwinter by the end of the week.
