Music

Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th October 9 - October 13

Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade

This week we will continue our work on This Little Light of Mine by introducing a very basic harmony part. We will practice our rhythm game and get better at focusing on our individual and group parts during the game.

We will also start listening to the harmony part for Do Re Mi.

Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

I will be collecting their Theory Pages Lesson 2: Line notes and Space notes, and handing out Theory Pages Lesson 3: The Treble Clef, which will be due next Monday, October 16th.

This week we will be pairing students up to practice our Lesson 3 - Pentatonic Scale Exercises. We will begin some new songs that only use three or four notes, so that they can practice using one or two of their closed notes in each song. We will also review Rhythm Exercise 3.

Our new songs include: The Boatman, Long Legged Sailor, and for extra credit, Music's Everywhere.

If students experience frustration during practice, please encourage them to slow down and practice each exercise or song one step at a time.

Our biggest challenges right now are practicing often enough to maintain note identification, and keeping our eyes on the page while we play.

I am starting to see a split between students who practice often, and students who have put in minimal practice. Those who practice regularly experience more success and are more confident in class. Please encourage your students to practice! :)

Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 4th grade

I will be collecting their Theory Pages on Sharps and Flats.

We will be going over What Child is This, and discussing our goals as a class for upcoming performance opportunities. We are considering performing at the Downtown Christmas Preview (after sunset), and possibly also a radio spot on KZFR. This would put our class focus on Christmas music through December.

We will also review our rhythm exercises and practice interval ear training.
