Music

Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th October 16 - October 20

Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade

We will be completing our rhythm game unit on eight notes, quarter notes and rests, and continuing to practice our harmony with This Little Light of Mine. Last week saw a definite improvement in focus and attention on individual parts while multiple parts were being played (clapped).

We will begin working on the harmony section of Do Re Mi.

We will begin to listen to and learn Christmas Around the World.

Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

Please ensure that your child is finishing their theory homework at home so that they come to school prepared to learn on Mondays. Theory homework pages are pages that go over how to identify notes on the staff. Their Lesson 2: Lines and Spaces pages were due last Monday, Oct. 8th, and Lesson 3: The Treble Clef, is due today, Oct 16th. Turning in homework late is better than not turning it in at all, which will more seriously impact their grade.

Practicing at home is a big part of what brings success in the classroom. Learning to read music is similar to learning a new language. If a student is feeling frustrated or like they cannot identify the notes they are being asked to play, please remind them that the instructions on how to do Note ID are on all of their homework pages. All the tools they need are available to them within the homework pages as well; If they try, and continue to try, they will succeed.

Most students did well on The Boatman last week, and should have started learning Long Legged Sailor. These are both simple songs that use four or fewer notes. The most important part of practice is in keeping their eyes on the page, so that they are not simply memorizing sounds and finger placements, but the notes themselves.

They will begin learning Music's Everywhere this week, and if we have time we will begin our C scale and go over some potential selections for the Christmas concert. They will have their C scale (learning two new notes, F and B) to review with exercises over the weekend as well.

Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 4th grade

Those who did not turn in their Theory Pages on Sharps and Flats should be prepared to turn it in this week.

Our more advanced students have begun to work on the Chord Melody version of What Child is This, while others focus on the melody alone. We will also review some of our songs from last year in preparation for a short performance on the school service day on November 3rd.

If we have time we will play an ear training game that will help them put into practice the identification of intervals we have been reading on in our F Scale Interval Exercises.
