Music

Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th October 23 - October 27

Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade

Our class is learning a song called "Christmas Around the World." I will be sending out an email with a link to it to all parents this afternoon.

It is a sweet song that talks about different traditions that countries around the world participate in during Christmas time. There are 10 countries represented, and if any of our families are interested in making some props that are talked about in the song, we would love that (myself and the class - the kids were very into the idea;)

They have been doing a great job on both their rhythm and harmony practice that we've been working on with This Little Light of Mine and Do Re Mi.

Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

Please review your child's binder and ensure that they are completing their work. There are still students who have not completed their theory pages - written homework on Lesson 2: Line notes and space notes, and Lesson 3: The Treble Clef. Completing these pages helps them understand what is happening in class, and those who have not done so are beginning to fall behind.

I will be collecting and correcting their homework page on Music's Everywhere this week.

We are reviewing the information gathered on our quizzes from last week and beginning our C scale notes this week. They will be working on two new notes: F and B.

We will start learning the low harmony part for In the Bleak Midwinter, which also uses the Bb note.

We will also begin looking at chords this week. The G chord is our hardest chord, so ideally they will practice this one every day. They will also begin learning C, Am, F, D, and A, in preparation for our Christmas Concert.

Thank you for reminding them to practice and complete their assignments!

Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 4th grade

Last call for Theory pages on Sharps and Flats. Not turning it in will negatively impact their grade, so please check with your child on whether or not they have completed this.

This week we are reviewing songs we learned last year, in preparation for a performance at Amber Grove Place during our service day on November 3rd. How Far I'll Go, Joy to the World, We Three Kings, and Waka Waka are under review.

We will continue learning the Chord Melody part to What Child is This, and play some interval ear training games as we work on recognizing our intervals by line and space as well as by ear.

Mr. Raj – Grades 5 & 6 October 23 - October 27

Welcome to quarter 2!

Science. We will begin diving into the content of our science textbook. Starting with Chapter 11.

Bible: Having finished our lesson on names we will now get into the questions: 'how to pray?'

Character Trait Corner – In Chapel this past week we talked about how words can damage our hearts. I told them that I don't agree with the saying 'Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me'. We tore up a heart every time a comment was made that was mean or rude, then some students worked to put it back together. We saw that while the heart may look similar to how it was before, it will never be the same. As we move into Integrity, I hope the students keep their heart for Jesus and continue to choose words that lift us up instead of tearing us down.

Bible: As we wind down reading Genesis, I would like to encourage you to read along with us. We are using the New Living Translation (it matches the Adventist Encounter Curriculum). As we have discussed throughout this chapter, individuals have made poor decisions and their lives have suffered the consequences. I remind students, this is not a work of fiction, it is similar to a history book. It covers the good, bad, and ugly but it also teaches us how our decisions impact our life, in the hopes we won't make the same mistakes as those who went before. This week we will have Week of Prayer, so we won't be reading, but maybe take this opportunity to read ahead. The week of October 30-November 3, we will read Chapters 39-50.
