




Signing You and/or Your Student In or/out at School

Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th November 6 - November 9

Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade

We will continue the rhythm game we started last week (quarter, eighth, and half notes).

The kids are also taking turns acting as harmony and melody leaders on different, with varying success. Practice makes progress!

Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

We will continue to work on our C scale and work in pairs to ensure everyone is understanding how to play each of the notes. Practice is essential here. Mentally understanding how to make a note is no substitute for giving the body time to process and physically repeating the act of putting one's fingers on the correct fret and string.

The more one practices, the more the body remembers!

We will also continue First Noel and the harmony part (Uke II) of Bleak Midwinter.

I am beginning to separate the kids into partnership tracks. Those who have been practicing diligently and learning the material we have been working on will begin to take the lead melody parts in the songs we learn. Those who have practiced less, or who have been having more of a challenge with the material will begin to work on the harmony parts.

Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 4th grade

Those who did not get a chance to learn Long, Long Ago Variations will start looking at it this week. Those who did will review it.

We will also begin looking at some new chords in the key of Bb, and reviewing how to identify notes in that key.

They will have the song Hall of Fame by The Script to begin practicing by this weekend.
