Music

Ms. May - Grades 1st - 4th November 13- November 17

Beginning Music and Motion: 1st and 2nd Grade

We will be practicing our harmonies in smaller groups this week, so I can assess how our overall ear training is going. It's been great to see some of the kids opening up and becoming more outgoing as they volunteer to lead their groups.

We are also continuing our level 3 rhythm game with This Little Light of Mine. This will probably be our last week on this module, as we start to work more on our movements for Christmas Around the World.

Ukulele 1 (Beginners): 3rd and 4th grade

We are working on our C scale, recognizing our closed and open notes, and playing our songs smoothly and evenly, with accurate timing.

Students should focus on learning/practicing The First Noel (melody) and Bleak Midwinter (harmony/Uke 2 part).

Students who have already reached a comfortable level with these two assignments may begin working on the Uke 1 part/ melody of Bleak Midwinter.

The divide is growing in this group between those who practice regularly and those who don't. Please encourage your kids to practice, and if they are struggling, remind them they can always start at the beginning with their Note ID steps that (included on each homework page) and Pentatonic/C Scale answer key pages.

Ukulele 2 (Intermediate): 4th grade

We will review the concept of triads, and how to identify each chord in a scale. In order to improve our chord melody skills, we will practice chord spelling to assess which chords/harmonies best support a given melody.

All intermediate students should be practicing their chord melody arrangement of What Child is This.

Please ask them to show you how it's going! Chord melody is a challenging skill to practice, so it may take some time before they are confident with it. Your interest and encouragement at this stage helps give them the boost they need to continue practicing.

If we have time, we will also be checking in on their speed trials of Long Long Ago variations, and playing ear training games.

Continue to look at and practice #15-24 in your Methods 1 book.

VIP: Lucia is our VIP this week. We are so blessed to have her as a part of our class.

Classroom Thanksgiving Celebration: Thank you for the amazing response to the group text about our upcoming Thanksgiving Celebration. In Social Studies we have been learning about how things were long ago compared to today. Now the students will be able to try out a few ways that things were done long ago as we learn about what life might have been like for people long ago.

We are also reading a book called "Stone Soup" and I am asking that each student bring one item from home that we can put in soup we will be making. This should be something you already have at home. You do not need to go buy anything extra. This might be a carrot, potato, cabbage, onion, etc. <u>They need to have this item here by</u> <u>Wednesday this week</u>.
