I hope you had a wonderful weekend! We have two weeks left until Christmas break; they are going to be a fun couple of weeks, but very busy.

One of the big events we are focusing on right now is our Read-a-thon fundraiser. Reading is such a fundamental skill that plays a crucial role in your child's academic and personal development. In your teacher's Newsnotes, they are going to share a highlight from their language arts program, and I also want to share with you some of the daily reading that takes place in the classrooms across the curriculum.

In our Language Arts classes, students explore a wide range of literary genres, including fiction, nonfiction, poetry, and drama. Through reading novels, short stories, and plays, students develop their comprehension skills, expand their vocabulary, and enhance their critical thinking abilities. In addition to fiction, our students also delve into the world of nonfiction texts.
